Two free events series return to Downtown Evansville

ANNOUNCEMENT – May 10, 2021: The DOWNTOWN EVANSVILLE – Economic Improvement District (EID) announces the return of two Downtown programming series, Tuesday Tunes & Treats and the Downtown Evansville Yoga Series. Both event series are free to attend and open to the community.

Tuesday Tunes & Treats launched in 2020 as the EID expanded its efforts to connect with the Downtown daytime population. The series kicks off Tuesday, May 11 from 11:30 AM – 1 PM at Game Room Alley (217 Main Street) and will feature music from local musician Angel Rhoades. Treats will be provided by Bargetown Market. Guests are encouraged to stop by during their lunch break, listen to tunes, and grab a free treat, courtesy of the EID. The weekly series will run through July 27. The Downtown Evansville Yoga Series Presented by Evansville Teachers Federal Credit Union returns Wednesday, May 12 at 5:30 PM. The series has a new location this year, the lawn of the Reitz Home Museum (112 Chestnut Street). Classes will be led by Zola Johnson, a certified instructor, and are open to all skill levels. Participants should bring their own mat and water to stay hydrated. The series will take place Wednesdays through June 30.
